While attending AMDA, she also had the opportunity to attend the New York City campus, where she performed in different dance performances and choreography showcases. While on the east coast, Jessica also performed at Hershey Park and Downtown Disney in Orlando, FL as a featured dancer. She hopes to continue dancing within the theme park industry in the years to come. She also grew a passion for acting where she was a featured actress in multiple short films for Upstate Studios. Beyond performing, Jessica has a passion for educating. She has taught dance for over 9 years; she currently teaches and choreographs for multiple hometown dance studios all over the Central New York region. Jessica also works within the Drama Department at Syracuse University where she teaches tap. She judges at Nexstar Dance Competition where she provides valuable critiques to up and coming dancers. In the coming years, Jessica hopes to grow her artistry through educating, choreographing, dancing, acting, judging, public speaking, and writing.

She has a background in Ballet, Pointe, Tap, Jazz, Lyrical, Contemporary, Acro, Musical Theater, Hip Hop, Modern, Cheerleading/Dance-team, and Pageantry. Carly travels around the Country as a dance competition judge regionally and nationally. She has also judged many pageants locally and was on the panel for Miss Worcester/Shrewsbury- a preliminary for Miss Massachusetts. Carly was the recipient of the Arthur Pierce Prize in 2007 and was awarded the Joan Phelps Scholarship for Dance. She has been teaching at various studios in RI and MA for the past thirteen years, where her students and choreography have won many high score and choreography awards.
